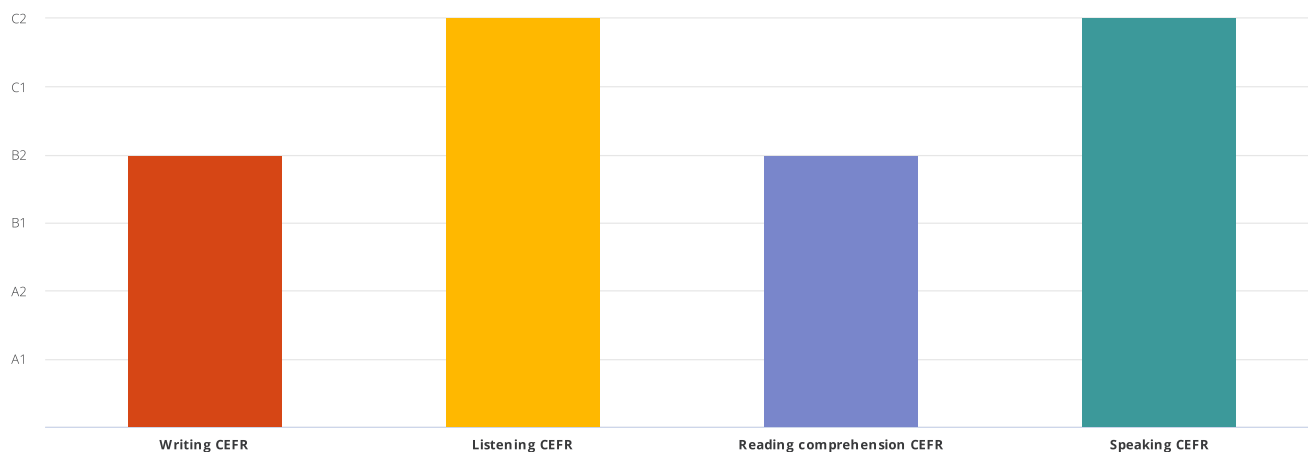

SCORE RATIONALE:

While the candidate demonstrates good B1 level English with clear communication and appropriate vocabulary, the response significantly exceeds the required word limit of 100-120 words (approximately 165 words). The answer successfully addresses all content requirements: film title with reason for choice, detailed appreciation of characters/plot/atmosphere/emotions, personal impact, and invitation to watch. Grammar and coherence are strong with appropriate connectors. However, the substantial length violation is a critical failure to follow explicit task instructions. At B1 level, respecting word count constraints is essential. The quality of content cannot compensate for this fundamental task requirement breach.

SCORE RATIONALE:

The candidate's answer meets all required criteria. It contains 6 sentences, appropriate for the 5-7 sentence requirement. The text includes a greeting ('Hello Mary!'), asks about the friend's state ('How are you?'), provides personal information about work and gym activities, and includes two clear questions ('What about you, how is your job going?' and 'do you have any plans for the summer holidays?'). The logical flow is coherent and natural. The language complexity is appropriate for A2 level, using simple present tense, basic vocabulary, and straightforward sentence structures without errors that would impede communication.

SCORE RATIONALE:

The candidate successfully addresses all required topics: housing (furnished apartment suggestion with friend's Boston example), language (conversation group advice), and administrative formalities (cousin's New York visa experience). The tone is friendly and supportive throughout. The response demonstrates B1-level English with clear, well-structured sentences, appropriate vocabulary, and good coherence. Examples from diverse experiences are effectively integrated. Minor observations: the response could have elaborated slightly more on expatriate-specific challenges, but overall meets the criteria comprehensively and appropriately for the B1 level.

Be sure to write a structured and coherent text, using logical connectors and precise and varied vocabulary.

Today, many people talk about remote work and it is a very trendy topic in the business world. In my opinion, it is a good idea, but it also has some problems.

First, remote work has many advantages. People can organize their time better. For example, they do not need to travel to the office, so they save time. Also, they can spend more time with their family.

SCORE RATIONALE:

While the essay demonstrates adequate B2 competence in structure and basic argumentation, it falls short of task requirements. The word count is approximately 150 words, significantly below the required 200-250 words. Although the candidate presents a clear position, advantages, disadvantages, and a recommendation, the arguments lack sufficient specificity and depth. The vocabulary is relatively simple and repetitive for B2 level. Logical connectors are present but underutilized. The mention of alternative viewpoints is minimal. The essay reads more like a B1+ response—competent but underdeveloped for the B2 standard expected for this task.

The candidate demonstrates B1-level competence with clear main ideas about digital tools usage in work and personal contexts. The response shows good understanding and ability to explain reasons. However, the answer lacks depth in describing specific applications and could include more detailed explanations of how tools are used. Minor grammatical issues and somewhat limited vocabulary prevent a higher score.

The candidate demonstrates B1-level competence with good vocabulary and clear main ideas about Montreal. However, several grammatical errors and awkward constructions (e.g., 'ice-drake architecture,' 'construction seems endless,' missing articles) slightly impede clarity. The response shows understanding of the topic and expresses opinions effectively despite these issues.

The answer demonstrates solid understanding and addresses the question with relevant examples. However, several grammar errors and awkward constructions prevent it from reaching C1 level. The structure is clear but lacks the sophistication and precision expected at C1. The candidate shows good critical thinking but needs refinement in expression.

The candidate demonstrates solid B2-C1 level comprehension and expression. The answer is well-structured with clear arguments and personal reflection. However, it lacks the sophistication, nuance, and depth expected at C1 level. The vocabulary is accessible but somewhat repetitive, and the argumentation, while coherent, remains relatively straightforward without exploring implicit complexities from the audio.
